



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN
THE REPUBLIC OF SIERRA LEONE
AND
THE REPUBLIC OF MOZAMBIQUE

Delegations representing the Republic of Sierra Leone and the Republic of Mozambique (hereinafter referred to as the "Contracting Parties") met in Aqaba, the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan during the ICAN 2019 event on 3rd December, 2019 to discuss matters relating to air services arrangements between their respective territories.

The lists of both Delegations are attached hereto as **Appendix A**.

As a result of these discussions which were held in a very cordial and friendly atmosphere, the following understandings have been reached: -

1. **AIR SERVICES AGREEMENT**

Both Delegations adopted and initialed the text of the Air Services Agreement and its Annex (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Agreement"), which is based on the Yamoussoukro Decision and SAATM. A copy of the Agreement is attached hereto as **Appendix B**.

The two Delegations agreed to recommend to their respective Governments to sign the Agreement at the earliest possible date. The place and date of the signing will be communicated through diplomatic channels.

The Contracting Parties shall each act in conformity with the spirit of the Agreement on an administrative level from the date of it initialing until its entry into force.

2. **DESIGNATION**

Pursuant to Article 3 of the Agreement, the Contracting Parties agreed to the multiple designations of airlines.

3. **FREQUENCY AND CAPACITY**

The designated airlines of the Contracting Parties shall be entitled to operate unlimited frequencies for passengers and/or cargo without any restriction on aircraft type and capacity.

4. **TRAFFIC RIGHTS**

The designated airlines exercise may exercise unrestricted 3rd, 4th and 5th freedom traffic rights at intra-African points in accordance with the Yamoussoukro Decision.

The exercise of fifth freedom traffic rights while serving points outside Africa shall be agreed upon between the Contracting Parties.

5. **CODESHARING**

The designated airlines of either Contracting Party may operate flights code-shared with the designated airlines of the other Contracting Party or airlines of a third Party.

6. **ROUTE SCHEDULE**

The route schedule, which is specified in Annex 1 of the Agreement, may be amended from time to time by agreement between the Civil Aviation Authorities of the Contracting Parties through exchange of notes.

7. **CIVIL AVIATION COOPERATION**

Both delegations agreed to have a cooperation on training and technical assistance in different fields relating to civil aviation.




8. **ENTRY INTO FORCE**

This Memorandum of Understanding shall enter into force on the date of its signature.

The undersigned, being duly authorized by their respective Governments, have signed this Memorandum of Understanding and initialed the Agreement in duplicate both texts being equally authentic.


