IX. STANDING ORDER 23:

1. **Hon. Foday Rado Yokie** - on the issue of the over crowding at the Beaches. He said that he visited the Lumley Beach and he was disappointed to see that it was jam-packed. That it is against the Regulations on Ebola and the situation should be stopped immediately.
2. **Hon. Komba E. Koedoyoma** – as a rejoinder to what was raised by Hon. Foday Rado Yokie, said that very serious and effective bye-laws should be made. In addition, he said the Freetown City Council made an announcement that Fridays and Sundays were declared as “No Trading Days” , but a counter announcement was also made. He added that MDA’s should be present during the presentation of the Sub-Appropriation Committee reports, citing the Ministry of Finance and Economic Development which was thinly represented.
3. **Hon. Chernor R.M. Bah** - on a point of Order, S.O. 34, responded that
